Rivers of Living Water

John the Baptist, in two wonderful proclamations, declared the entire scope of Christ's work when he said, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world," and "He that sent me to baptize in water, the same is he that baptizeth in the Holy Ghost." Christ's twofold work was to take away sin and to baptize in the Spirit. "Now on the last day, the great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto me and drink. He that believeth on me, as the scripture hath said, FROM WITHIN HIM shall flow rivers of living water" (John 7:37-38, R.V.).

Christ promised to bestow a gift upon the one who received Him as Saviour, which would bring perfect satisfaction and sufficiency to him
